

NO.9 CORK STREET

Launched in October 2021, No.9 Cork Street is a hub for international galleries in the historic heart of Mayfair, London. Designed by architecture studio Matheson Whiteley, housed across two converted townhouses and spread across three floors, No.9 Cork Street hosts short-term exhibitions and projects organised by the world's leading galleries. The space provides a flexible, collaborative environment for galleries to connect with London audiences all year round.

Each participating gallery will benefit from a fully equipped gallery space, a private viewing room and a range of digital and social media services designed to enhance the visibility of their project at No.9 Cork Street. The event space is also available to host artist talks, screenings and receptions.


No.9 Cork Street aims to foster synergies across our community of participating galleries. We have coordinated the calendar dates for each exhibition space to encourage collaboration amongst participants and explore connections across projects.



NO.9 CORK STREET

No.9 Cork Street is located in the centre of London's gallery district, just North of the Royal Academy of Arts, within a few minutes walk from Green Park underground station and also close to Piccadilly Circus, Oxford Circus and Bond Street stations.

For nearly 100 years, the street has housed some of the most significant galleries and exhibitions in modern and contemporary art history. It was the heart of the British art world in the 20th century, introducing the UK to surrealism and artists such as Paul Klee and Joan Miró. Today, it has one of the highest concentrations of galleries in London, making it as important a destination for art lovers now as it was then.





GALLERY SPECIFICATIONS

Spread over 600m², No.9 Cork Street is home to three gallery spaces and accompanying viewing rooms. Gallery 1 and Viewing Room 1 are located on the ground floor. Galleries 2 and 3 and Viewing Rooms 2 and 3 are located on the first floor. Our flexible event space can be found on lower level one.

FURNITURE


Each viewing room comes with a large office desk and chairs. Participating galleries have the option to use the furniture provided.

LIGHTING

- Gallery-grade track lighting and white spotlights are included in the standard participation fee (lighting specification are available upon request)
- Additional bespoke lighting is available upon request and at an additional cost

SECURITY

- Live and recorded CCTV system with coverage of entrances and critical internal areas in each gallery space.
- Intruder alarm system with keypad activation.
- Front and internal doors with access control via RFID fob/card reader.



GALLERY 1 & VIEWING ROOM





GALLERY 2 & VIEWING ROOM




AUDIO VISUAL

HOW TO APPLY

The online application form for projects taking place in 2024 will be available in November.

The online application procedure requires that you complete the following information

- Gallery details
- Preferred exhibition dates and gallery space
- A list of artists represented by the gallery (for contemporary art galleries)
- A list of exhibitions from the last two years
- A brief history of the gallery
- A written proposal for your project
- Five small jpegs to illustrate your project proposal
- Five small jpegs which are representative of your gallery programme

We welcome exhibition proposals focusing on contemporary and modern art. Applicants must be a commercial venture and show a regular programme of exhibitions.

We will prioritise proposals from galleries who have recently participated in Frieze London, Frieze Masters, Frieze New York, Frieze Los Angeles or Frieze Seoul.

We accept joint proposals from galleries who wish to share their space. Depending on availability, we may consider proposals for exhibitions across several gallery spaces and calendar cycles.

No.9 Cork Street also welcomes proposals for public events organised in conjunction with a proposed exhibition, such as artist talks, performances and film screenings.


