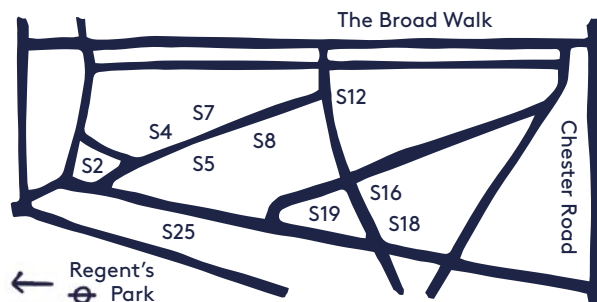


## Frieze Sculpture Education Guide
